Official Tournament Rules

- **OFF Limits:** Pre-Tournament Off Limits are established as March 1st of the current year through the morning of the BBB Open. No tournament angler or boat is permitted on tournament water during the off-limits period. Tournament Off-limits areas will be established and announced at the tournament meeting. Contestants violating the pre-tournament or tournament off-limits will be immediately disqualified. Contestant's boats must remain in tournament waters during the event.
- **Pre-Tournament Meeting:** Friday, April 17, 6:30 PM at the weigh in area (Caldwell Ramp).
- **Protests:** Protests must be made in writing within 15 minutes of the official closing of the scales. Decisions of the tournament director are final.
- **Entry Deadline /Boat Draw:** Paid entries are due by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday April 16. Boat draw will take place on Friday, April 17th. Draw results will be announced at the pre-tournament meeting. **LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!!**
- **Check In:** All tournament boats must check in at the official checkpoint when returning for weigh in. The checkpoint location will be communicated during the pre-tournament meeting and/or prior to blast off. It is each angler's responsibility to know where the check point will be located prior to blast off. This check in is mandatory for safety and for flight verification. If leaving early, please return your motor banner to the weigh in trailer. Checking in late will result in disqualification.
- **Disqualification:** Disqualification for any reason will result in forfeiture of all entry and option fees.
- **Safety:** State, Federal, and Local Laws must be obeyed. Safe boating must be observed always. Each contestant is required to wear a fastened, U.S. Coast Guard approved, personal flotation device anytime the engine is in operation (running) from launch until weigh-in. All boats must be equipped with an emergency ignition shut-off device, which must be securely attached to the driver's body anytime the combustion engine is engaged/in gear.
- **Permitted Fishing Methods:** All bass must be caught alive in a conventional sporting manner. Only artificial lures may be used (except for pork trailers). Only one fishing rod may be used at any one time. Additional rods may be in the boat and ready for use, however, each cast and retrieve must be completed before another cast or rod is used. Trolling with the combustion engine as a method of fishing is prohibited. Switching or sharing fish with other teams or individuals will result in immediate disqualification. No touch rule is in effect. All angling must be conducted from the boat. At no time may a contestant leave the boat to land a fish or to make the boat more accessible to fishing waters. Nets are allowed.
- **5 fish limit per boat.** There can be no more than 5 bass in the live well. Contestants can NOT cull dead fish. Culling dead fish will result in disqualification. Every effort must be made to keep bass alive using a properly aerated live well. A .25-pound penalty will be deducted from each dead fish weighed at the final weigh-in. Dead fish are not eligible to be weighed as a "Big Bass".
- All bass must be 12 inches or over to be weighed. Measurement is to be done with the mouth closed and tail fanned. Any contestant weighing a short (Less than 12") fish will be disqualified.
- Contestants must not have Alcohol or Narcotics in their possession during the tournament hours, except for prescription medications. Alcoholic beverages are permitted after your fish are weighed (Unless prohibited by the host marina).
- **Boat Operation:** During the hours of competition contestants may not receive assistance from non-competitors; follow a non-competitor's boat, or the placing of markers of non-competitors. The use of mobile communication devices such as cellular phones, marine radios, walkie-talkies, CBs, etc., to communicate fishing information during tournament hours is strictly prohibited.
- Entrants may be given a polygraph test. Failure to take a test will result in disqualification. Contestants must provide written notice upon tournament entry of any failed polygraph test (in relation to a fishing tournament). Any person who has failed a polygraph test in connection with any fishing tournament for cheating will be subject a review by the tournament director and/or the tournament board before being allowed to enter a BBB Tournament.
